Top-Down

- Sector and technical modeling

What is a LEDS? No one-size-fits-all

- An outline of national development goals
- A summary of economic data and an inventory of national GHG emissions
- Assessments of development threats, including climate change impacts, security, etc.
- A long-term projection of business-as-usual economic growth and GHG emissions, identified development "pathways", and whole-of-economy and/or sector-specific goals
- A prioritized portfolio of alternative actions and policies that improve economic growth, respond to vulnerabilities, and lower the long-term emissions trajectory
- Implementation and financing plans for highpriority actions (linked to country budgets) and monitoring to measureable progress in implementing actions

A low emission development strategy (LEDS) is unique to each country's development goals and circumstances. A LEDS is a country-owned national-level framework or strategy that achieves a country's development and economic growth objectives while, at the same time, seeking to reduce the growth rate of greenhouse gas emissions over the longer term.

- Build on Strategic Energy Planning modeling work
- Support for LEDS Development or Existing LEDS Implementation in four target countries within the Energy Community: Albania, Macedonia, Serbia and Moldova

Support for LEDS at the regional level building on existing Energy Community framework

- Modeling support for new Energy Community Regional Energy Strategy Task Force
- Promote Regional Transmission Planning for integrating renewables and strengthening regional electricity markets
- Work with Energy Community Regulatory Boards (ECRB) in harmonizing regulatory framework for clean energy and market monitoring

Supports National Development Priorities

1. Enhance capacity to build a LEDS

- Build national capacity to implement LEDS analytical framework and assess the real costs and barriers to low carbon development and investment
- Establish and strengthen capacity to develop national GHG Emissions Inventories and measure, report and verify (MRV) emission reductions
- Support economic data collection and delivery

2. Support LEDS implementation

- Assist with policy development and harmonization of regulatory framework
- Build capacity to implement RE and EE action plans
- Promote EE initiatives for low income residents
- Help develop accreditation certification schemes for EE and GHG MRV
- 3. Develop shared knowledge on LEDS within Energy Community and Globally



Next Steps

- Assessment of Regional Needs & Opportunities with focus on Albania, Macedonia, Serbia and Moldova. Consultations with:
 - Relevant Ministries (e.g., Economy, Environment, Development, etc.),
 - Inter-Ministerial Working Groups on Climate Change
 - Private Sector and Civil Society
- Develop Coordinated Approach and Strategy with participating countries
- Confirmation of Interest and development of national LEDS work plans with host country government partners
